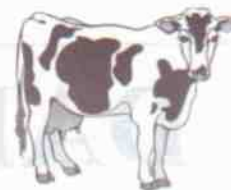

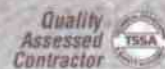

4-H SECTION CONVENOR:

The 4-H Section of the NAPANEE Fair provides an opportunity for 4-H members to display the skills they have learned during their participation in the County 4-H program. 4-H members are encouraged to participate in all parts of the program at the Napanee Fair.

NOTE: There is no fee charged for 4-H member entries.

1. 4-H CLUB EXHIBITS

1. All 4-H Clubs in Lennox and Addington County who have operated in the previous twelve months may enter a 3 sided clubboard exhibit.
2. The exhibits are to display the activities of the club.
3. Exhibits shall include the name of the club.
4. Exhibits must be submitted to the 4-H project barn between 2:00 - 4:00 PM or 6:00 - 9:00 PM on Thursday, July 29th NO EXCEPTIONS. Exhibits must be removed by Monday, August 2nd between 5:00 - 6:00 PM.

2. 4-H PROJECTS

1. 4-H members who have been active in the past 12 months are required to enter the same number of projects as Clubs they were in up to a maximum of 4. They may certainly enter more if they choose.
2. A list of specific classes is available from the Lennox & Addington leaders, or the 4-H newsletter.
3. Entries must be brought to the Junior Building between 2-4 or 6-9 p.m. on **THURSDAY, JULY 29th**. They must be removed on **MONDAY, AUGUST 2nd** between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. only. No exception to these times will be allowed.
4. Prizes will be in an amount approved by the local Association.
5. All visitors are encouraged to vote for their favourite project for the "People's Choice Award."

CODE OF ETHICS FOR 4-H MEMBERS SHOWING AT NAPANEE FAIR:

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being unethical in the Show Ring.

1. Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the Class in which it is shown.
2. Minimizing the effects of crampiness or lameness by feeding or injecting drugs.
3. Surgery of any kind performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats, horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
4. Insertion of foreign material under the skin.
5. Criticizing or interfering with the Judge or other exhibitors while in the Show Ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed show.
6. No 4-H member, or other person acting on behalf of the member, shall have in his possession or control:
 - i) Any hypodermic syringes, needle or other device;
 - ii) Swabs, cloth or other material; or
 - iii) Any medicine, preparation or substance for use in contravention of the Code of Ethics.

Subject to the decision of the 4-H Leaders present, anyone who cannot comply with this Code shall be disqualified and unable to participate further in the 4-H Show.
