In awarding the prizes, artistic skill and taste in arrangement will be considered, as well as the quality of the flowers and plants exhibited. The judges are instructed not to award a prize unless, in their opinion, merits. Society not responsible for containers broken. No entry fee. Exhibits may be brought in on Thursday from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. and on Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. **DOORS WILL BE CLOSED FRIDAY FROM 12:00 noon TO 5:00 p.m. FOR JUDGING.** Exhibits must remain until 5:00 p.m. Monday whether they are awarded a prize or not. No design to be used more than two years in a row. **ONLY ONE ENTRY IN EACH CLASS.** Amateurs only. Prize money that is to be issued by cheque will have a 10% administration fee deducted.
