



## CLASS 18 - PHOTOGRAPHY

**RULES AND REGULATIONS:** Only amateur photos will be accepted. Only one photo will be allowed to be entered in each section, unless it is a group. All photos must be 4" x 6" and no larger than 5" x 7". All photos must be regular photo paper. All photos must be labelled as to what class they are on the bottom border of the front side. It must be mounted on WHITE Bristol board with only a one inch (1") border. Must be labelled with its various class to be judged. All photos must be recent within the past year. No photos will be accepted in a frame or matte. All entries must stay in place until 5:00 p.m. Monday night of the Fair or winnings will be sacrificed. Exhibits can be brought in on Thursday between 4 - 7 p.m., and Friday between 8:00 a.m. and 12 Noon. Judging will take place at 1 p.m. Friday. Hope to see you there.

### SECTION:

- 1. THE FIRST TIME:** The first time skating, riding a bike, skipping a rock, baby's discovery of toes or driving a tractor. Can be anything. Look for excitement in the faces, the surprise or the defeat.
- 2. TRUE LOVE:** Can be between siblings, child and pet or mother and child. Look for the connection either physical or emotional.
- 3. NIGHT SCENE:** Fireworks, skyline, sunset/sunrise or even late night farm work. May need to use a tripod to achieve better focus and longer exposure times. Don't have a tripod try a fence post, a rock or car hood and anything solid.
- 4. THE COLOUR GREEN:** Look for objects/events strong in this colour. Remember opposite colours may set off the desired colour even more.
- 5. PATTERNS:** Look for any pattern, could be colour fence posts, birds on a wire or even wrenches all lined up in a row. Remember simple is often the best.
- 6. MY BACKYARD/AROUND THE HOUSE:** Look around your property, sometimes objects you see everyday may be extraordinary to someone else. The old water pump, the pile of rocks or that old tree. Try looking at the ordinary from a different point of view. Lay down on the ground or climb a ladder.
- 7. YEARS GONE BY:** Look for rusted out tractors, trucks and cars. Old gas pumps and buildings. A good idea is flea markets. Grandparents' house, backcountry roads. Don't be afraid to get in close and take a picture of a rusted old nail.

**8. KIDS IN THEIR ENVIRONMENT:** Playgrounds, beaches and empty barns and some places kids like to be themselves. Try to catch them unaware you are taking their picture, it will look more natural and you will have a better chance to catch their personalities.

**9. MY VACATION:** Could be from anywhere from half way down the block or halfway around the world. Best vacation photos usually include a location and a human subject. Have the picture tell a story, not just a person standing in front of a tower.

**10. FACIAL EXPRESSIONS:** Young or old, cute or experienced. Make sure you can see the face, the close the better sometimes.

**11. ENHANCED PHOTOS:** In this modern day and age it's amazing what can be done to improve a photo. Submit the original photo plus the enhanced photo for comparison. Open subject matter keeping in mind it is a family showing. Enhancements can be computer generated, hand tinted or any other creative ideas. The creator of the original photograph must do all the work.
